



INDEMNITY AND WAIVER FORMS. The Horse Committee will take all care in managing the Section, but competitors taking part in this Horse Section do so at their own risk. Each adult competitor must, before competing, complete and sign a form indemnifying the Junee Show Society and waiving any claims against the Society for any injury sustained in competition or for loss or damage to the competitor's property or damage caused by the competitor or his/her animal(s) at the Show. A similar form must also be completed and signed by a parent or guardian for each competitor who is under 18 years of age. ALSO, all competitors must complete a Horse Health Declaration, each horse which the competitor has bought onto the Showgrounds must be listed together with the Property Identification Code (PIC) of the property from which the horse came to the Show. Wristbands must be worn by all competitors/exhibitors.



RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All horse Competitions will be conducted under approved Peak Body and Breed Society Registration Rules and Regulations
- Outside assistance to competitors by word, radio or any other means in horse ring events will not be permitted. If in breach of the ruling, competitors and their exhibits may be dismissed from the event and the showground and the competitor's name will be submitted to AgShows NSW.
- Horses in appropriate classes must be registered with their Breed Societies and copies of registrations must be available for presentation on request.
- Novice: Open to all competitors who have not won a first prize in a solo event at an agricultural show.
- Stallions and colts may only compete in classes where specifically permitted and MUST have a bit in their mouth.
- Ridden stallion or colt classes must be ridden by rider 18yrs and over.
- Authorized persons only allowed in Rings.
- Show Hunters: If a horse competes in open height classes e.g. Hack ring, they are not eligible to enter Show Hunter classes and vice versa. Show Hunter Hack is not eligible for Supreme Champion Hack.
- Exhibitor/rider numbers to be worn in the ring.
- PIC number must be printed clearly on waivers. If no PIC number, entry will not be accepted.
- Local Rider must reside in Junee Shire.
- Ringmaster's decision is final.

PRE-REGISTRATION NOW AVAILABLE

We have introduced the opportunity to register prior to show day in addition to registering on the day. It does not cost to register. Please email completed signed **AgShows Horse Health Declaration and indemnity/waiver forms** to juneeshowsocietyringevents@hotmail.com before midnight Monday 20th October 2025. Your package, including wristbands and registration numbers will be ready for collection at the ring van on arrival.

Please note, it is your responsibility to ensure that you wear at all times in the ring, the correct rider/exhibitor number, and that you provide the correct horse number to the ring stewards. If you provide the incorrect number in the ring, you could be giving your points to another exhibit and the possibility of not qualifying for your preferred Royal. Please note, amendments will not be made at the van.

Drug testing may be carried out at this Show. Any competitor found to have breached the AGSHOWS NSW Disputes and Disciplinary Regulations will be investigated by the AGSHOWS NSW Disciplinary Committee.

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants and must be printed in all schedules.

INGREDIENTS:

250 q sultanas

250 g chopped raisins

250 g currants

125 g chopped mixed peel

90 g chopped red glace cherries

90 g chopped blanched almonds

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250 g plain flour

60 a self-raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

250 g butter

250 g soft brown sugar

½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

½ teaspoon almond essence

½ teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs.

RECOMMENDED METHOD: Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square $20\text{cm} \times 20\text{cm} (8" \times 8")$ tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately $3 \frac{1}{2} - 4$ hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin. Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Please note that the cooked cake should not exceed 5.7cm in height.

- 4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available as in the case of a hand spun/felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
- 5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
- 6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- 7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- 8. An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State Level.
- 9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
- 10. 





RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 Entries must be made in writing on the proper form provided and lodged with the Secretary on or before the Wednesday prior to the Show unless otherwise specified. Entries must be accompanied by the prescribed fee.
- 2 All exhibits must be on the ground at the time specified in the timetable and must be placed in the pens or space allotted, and exhibitors shall fix such cards or marks thereon as the Committee may direct. Local exhibits must not be removed from the pavilion before 6.30pm on the night of the Show unless otherwise arranged. Exhibits left after that time will be entirely at exhibitors risk.
- 3 Every care will be taken with exhibits but the Committee retains the right to close the Pavilion at 6pm on the night of the Show to all except Stewards. Pavilion will reopen at 6.30pm for collection of exhibits.
- 4 All protests must be lodged in writing with the Secretary within 24 hours after the event and accompanied by a fee of \$100. The decision of the Committee on any protest shall be final.
- 5 All exhibits must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor or his principal. All agricultural and horticultural exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 6 If the judges consider the exhibits in any Class do not possess sufficient merit to deserve a prize, the same may be withheld at their discretion.
- 7 Prize money will be payable on Show Day after 5.00pm at the Secretary's Office. Any prize money not claimed on Show Day will be forfeited unless prior arrangements have been made.
- 8 The signing of an entry form for an exhibit of livestock is accepted by the committee as a guarantee that the exhibits specified therein are free from disease so far as it is known by the owner and in case of any infectious disease being spread through or by an exhibit, the exhibitor only and not the Association shall be held responsible therefore. The Committee reserves the right to reject or remove any exhibit without assigning any reason.
- 9 If called upon by the Committee, exhibitors must make a Statutory Declaration that their exhibit or exhibits conform with the conditions under which the prize or prizes for which they compete are offered. The Committee may absolutely withhold payment of any prize unless such Declaration shall be made within one month of the date when the exhibitor shall be called upon.
- 10 No exhibit will be allowed to compete for more than one prize and for champion prizes, except where specified.
- 11 Stallions shall be eligible to compete where specified and must be handled by an adult person.
- 12 No competing exhibit will be allowed to exhibit or wear any ribbon, badge or make until it has been finally judged.
- 13 No exhibitor shall be allowed with the Judge during judging, except by special request of the Judge who may refuse to judge the exhibit of any exhibitor

- infringing this rule. The owner of any exhibit disapproved of shall at once remove same when directed by the Stewards.
- 14 Any person willfully infringing or violating any of these Regulations shall forfeit all claims to any prize he or she may have been awarded and shall be liable to be prohibited from exhibiting at any of the Society's future exhibitions.
- 15 The Society shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibit, and it shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Society harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any accident, loss or damage, or misdelivery of any exhibits.
- 16 No exhibit shall be removed from the Showground for the duration of the Show, unless otherwise arranged by the Stewards.
- 17 In any section, "local" shall mean that the exhibitor resides within the Junee Shire.
- 18 Age will be determined as of 1 October in the Year of the Show.
- 19 Outside assistance to competitors by word, radio or any other method in all events eg. Horse Ring Events will NOT be permitted. If in breach of this ruling, competitors and their exhibits may be dismissed from the event and from the showground Competitor names to be submitted to the AGSHOWS NSW.
- 20 Agree that he/she/they will compete/exhibit at the Junee Show at his/her/their own risk.
- 21 Agree that he/she/they will compete/exhibit at his/her/their own risk and to indemnify and keep indemnified Junee Show Society, together with any other organisation or person involved in the conduct of any show against all claims, suits, actions or demands which may be brought in respect of any injury or other loss sustained by him/her/them in the course of competing/exhibiting at the Show and agree to exonerate the Committee or Management of the Show Society together with any other person or organisation or person involved in the conduct of Junee Show from all responsibility and from all loss or injury to him/her/them whether due to alleged negligence or otherwise.
- 22 The Committee has directed that no person shall be allowed to enter the Showground without paying admission charges unless they are in possession of a family ticket, or single ticket. Children of members accompanied by parents will be admitted free, providing they are 16 years & under.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL EXHIBITORS

Any exhibitors intending to bring electrical equipment to the Show grounds will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor.

This is essential for safety of yourself, your fellow exhibitors and the general public and is a requirement of the Work Health and Safety Act of 2012. The Act imposes very severe penalties in the event of non-compliance with its provision.

Please check all your electrical equipment and leads BEFORE you enter the Show grounds to avoid the occurrence of any difficulties.

- 2 Online entries may be made on Showday Online. Entries may be emailed.
- 3 Bring your entry form to the Show Office between 10am and 3.30pm during office opening hours (see below dates and times). The Secretary will issue you with your entry ticket. Or email your entry to juneeshowsociety@gmail.com (tickets will be sent with email confirmation of entry/ies, or upon request,printed for pick up at office).
- 4 Most Pavilion sections are judged on the Friday morning before the Show. We appreciate having entries at the Show ground as early as possible that morning as the Stewards must display all the entries prior to the judges starting work. Non-perishables may be left at the Show office any time in advance, during office hours listed below.
- 5 No competitors are allowed in the pavilion during judging. Pavilion will be closed from 10am on the Friday before the Show and will reopen to the public at 9.30am on Show Day.
- 6 Entries must remain in our care until 6.30pm Saturday night (Show Day). The Pavilion will close at 6pm on Show Day and will reopen at 6.30pm for competitors to collect their exhibits. Exhibitors must not remove any items prior to this time and without the direction of the Stewards of that section. We appreciate your patience in this regard. ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE COLLECTED.
- 7 If you have won prize money, you may collect it from the Secretary's Office (under the grandstand at the Show ground) from 5pm on Show Day. Any money not collected will be forfeited.
